FRUIT INDUSTRY GAINING

ENCOURAGING REPORTS TO BOARD OF HORTICULTURE.

Orchards Have Been Greatly Extended and 1908 Crop Will Be Valued at About \$9,000,000.

Reports submitted at the semi-annual meeting yesterday of the State Board of Horticulture show that fruit conditions throughout Oregon are improving rapidly and that the state is destined to become one of the greatest fruit-growing sections in the United States.

There are five horticultural districts in the state, each represented by a Commissioner. The first district comprises Washington, Tillamook, Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Yamhill and Clatsop counties. The second district are Marion, Polk, Linn, Lane, Benton and Lincoln counties, with C. A. Park as Commissioner.

The semi-annual report of President Newell shows that the 1907 crops were unusually profitable and with the money thus realized the growers have been able to obtain the most modern apparatus. The report also shows that an unusually large acreage has been set out in the last year. In the vicinity of Grants Pass many Turkey and European grapes have been set out and the Umpqua country is increasing its acreage in peaches.

In the Willamette Valley there is a marked increase in cherry and walnut plantings. Many peaches, apricots and pears have been planted in the vicinity of The Dalles and a new fruit region is being developed in the vicinity of Echo, Hermon and Irigon.

Commissioner Carson's report was to the effect that fruit conditions in the state are unusually favorable, one of the reasons being that the temperature of

the past winter did not exceed 36 degrees and there were no floods or rains that injured the orchards.

Commissioners James H. Reed, of Milwaukie; Charles A. Park of Salem; H. M. Webster, of The Dalles, and Secretary Williamson, of Portland, all submitted encouraging reports.
