'UNCLE JOE' A LITTLE LATE

MOVE AGAINST PAPER TRUST DUE A YEAR AGO.

Had Speaker Acted, Then He Could Have Realized More From Political Trick.

OREGON NEWS BUREAU, Washington, April 12.—When opportunity offers, "Uncle Joe" Cannon is quite as able as any other Presidential candidate, to turn a neat political trick. Not long after the United States Supreme Court declared the employees' liability act to be unconstitutional, Senator Cannon, knowing the strength of the labor vote, introduced a new liability bill which would meet the objections of the court and still afford labor that relief which it sought. So Speaker Cannon, realizing the seriousness of the appeal of the newspaper publishers of the country for a repeal of the duty on wood-pulp, seized the opportunity to introduce two resolutions in the House calling on the Department of Justice and the Department of Commerce and Labor for information as to what steps they have taken to demolish the paper trust. By this move the wily Speaker sought to kill two birds with a single stone. He wanted to curry favor with the newspaper publishers, and, being a staunch stand-patter, he wanted to head off the movement in the direction of altering the Dingley tariff law. He put forth his resolutions with a statement which made it appear that his resolutions would do far more toward bringing relief to the publishers

REWARD OF \$50 OFFERED

State Desires to Find the Four Escaping Trustees.

SALEM, Or., April 12.—(Special)—Fifty dollars reward has been offered for the capture of each of four state prison convicts who escaped from their guards last night. The four men were "trustees" and were employed in a gang of 20 prisoners working at the preparation of grounds for erection of new buildings for the institution for the feeble-minded. Bloodhounds traced them to the Southern Pacific Railroad track, when the escape was lost, indicating that the men boarded a train. The descriptions of the men are as follows:

Aerogram From Battleship Tells of Progress Northward.

ABOARD BATTLESHIP KANSAS, via Point Loma wireless station, San Diego, Cal., April 12.—Tonight the fleet is steaming steadily at 9 knots speed in squadron formation. The weather is cloudy and growing cooler rapidly. Early this morning a haze which amounted almost to a fog prevailed.

At 4 A. M. as the Connecticut altered her course to the northward, leading directly to San Diego, the whistles of the battleships sounded.
