Republicans and Democrats to Nominate Tickets for the June Election.

POLLS WILL OPEN AT NOON

Will Close at 7 P. M. and Two Parties Will Use Same Booths—Holiday to Be Observed—List of Different Polling Places.

The primary nominating election will be held today. The polls will open at noon and will close at 7 P. M.

County Clerk Fielda was busy supervising the arrangement of the polls all day yesterday.

Several hundred dollars on Cameron against the field have been wagered.

With Sinnott, Moser and Cole 1 to 3 was offered on either against the field, and while there are some few hundred dollars offered at this figure, few take care to give the odds asked.

A few bets were made on Coroner and Constable, the Mayor Lane-Tom Duffin battle last year, on which thousands of dollars change hands.

A \$100 bet is considered a large bet at this election. Even the new hat bets were extremely rare.

LOCAL OPTION FIGHT AT HAND. East Side Churches Prepare Campaign to Precede June Election.

The committee appointed at the meeting of the East Side pastors and laymen at the church yesterday afternoon.
