

Captain Hobson Predicts a Conflict Between White and Yellow Races.

DUTY OF UNITED STATES

This Nation Must Control Pacific to Prevent War That Will Drench World With Blood, Says the Congressman.

That conflict between the white and the yellow races will plunge the world into a deluge of blood, as it has never before, unless the balance of power is preserved, and that this fact can be accomplished only through the United States, was the statement made yesterday afternoon by Captain Richard Pearson Hobson, naval hero and congressman from Alabama, in an address before the Y. M. C. A. men's meeting.

The meeting was held at the White Temple at 330 P. M., and that edifice was filled to the doors by the audience that assembled. H. E. Mills was to have spoken at the Y. M. C. A., but a message was received from him saying that it would not be possible for him to arrive on time, and Captain Hobson volunteered his services. He received an ovation when he ascended the platform, and was applauded liberally throughout his speech.

ROCKS ON EITHER SIDE

Will Harry M. Calk, Republican candidate for United States Senator, have the internal machinery of his campaign in working order by May 14, the date of the State Convention of the party? This is the question that a host of astute politicians are asking, now that it has become known that Calk is trying to trim his sails to catch the breeze from both the Fulton and Bourne factions, which are at present the warring political elements in Oregon.

Since it became rumored that Calk was trying to please both the Fulton and the Bourne forces, a lot of the "gun-show" work that John C. Young, private secretary for Senator Bourne, has been doing has come to the surface. Young has been trying to round up friends for a scheme to send "uninstructed delegates" to the National Convention, but has found it hard sledding to do, and his repair wagon has been working overtime repairing the gaps in the Bourne political fences.

In a Nasty Tangle. The situation just now is in a nasty tangle. It will be remembered that the State Central Committee commended Senator Fulton's services in Washington, and was unambiguously silent about the manner in which Bourne was earning his salary. The committee also called upon the state convention to send to the Republican caucus a delegate from the Portland branch, and the committee did this, an infernal machine was set in motion. Calk was desirous of controlling both the caucus and the convention, and he wanted his brother W. M. Calk for chairman. Judge Calk was named as chairman, and now the Bourne people say that the caucus will elect Calk for the chairmanship of the Taft resolution.

Young hurried out from Washington and visited the state convention in behalf of Bourne's pet hobby, "A third elective term for Roosevelt." Young, so the story goes, felt well satisfied with his work, and the scattered Bourne forces were happy. After the convention, when Judge Calk was made chairman, and the Taft resolution was put through, Young then woke up and found that he was out of the picture. At any rate, the Bourne followers are weeping now.

The Democrats and the disgruntled Republicans have been quick to take advantage of the discord and day and night they are spreading the poison where they think it will do the most good. Another thing that has done much to fume was the rejection of Thomas McCusker and George M. Orton, both died in the wool Bourne supporters, as delegates to the state convention. The naming of T. Morris Dunne and George H. Williams, both anti-Bourne men, it has been claimed by the Calk forces that Bourne was not doing well.

When Senator Fulton was convinced that he had been beaten by Calk in the primaries he at once assured Calk of his support and urged all of his friends to do likewise. Fulton will stand by his promise, but whether, under the existing circumstances, he will be able to keep his friends in line, who just at present are extremely hostile, remains to be seen. The Democratic leaders say that Fulton will not be able to take his friends for Calk, and that not even the offer of the Calk people, as a bit of bait, to send the Senator to the National convention as a delegate, will serve the purpose.

The story that Fred W. Mulkey, ex-United States Senator, is about to open Taft headquarters will not help the situation any. Mulkey was charged at the Henry meeting with the prosecutor flayed Fulton, and the Democrats credit Mulkey with saying that Chamberlain would have little trouble in defeating Calk, so it would seem that Mulkey is not friendly to Calk, and it is sure that Fulton's friends have not forgiven him. Neither is Mulkey in with the Bourne crowd, for the ex-Senator has said that he withdrew from the Senatorial race because he did not get the proper support from the Statement No. 1 people, meaning Bourne.
