

SAILORS QUIT SMP

Hindu Seamen Take French Leave of Strathgyle.

HER SAILING IS DELAYED

Men Desert 24 Hours Ashore and Desert Vessel Without Further Ado—Delay Will Be Expensive to Owners of the Ship.

Departion of the ship by five Hindu sailors has delayed departure of the British steamer Strathgyle, lumber laden for Shanghai, and has entailed a loss of about \$500 to the owners of the vessel. The sailors walked ashore, leaving all their effects on board, about an hour before the hour set for sailing yesterday morning. They refused to return until they had been ashore for 24 hours.

ASTORIA, Or., May 17.—(Special.)—The body of Gust V. Sandy, watchman at the Sanborn coal wharf, who has been missing since the evening of Monday, May 4, was found yesterday in the river at the foot of Ninth street. It is supposed he fell overboard accidentally while waiting along the wharf. The deceased was a native of Sweden, 50 years old, and left a widow and several grown children. He was a member of the Longshoremen's Union and the funeral will be under the auspices of that organization.

ASTORIA, Or., May 17.—(Special.)—The Norwegian steamship Eric, en route from San Francisco to Victoria, B. C., put into this port yesterday for coal. She had but 10 tons in her bunkers. She had encountered rough headwinds coming up the coast and her supply of fuel had run short.
