

FACES JURY FOR DEATH OF CHILD

Ab Hembree on Trial at Dallas, Charged With Killing His Daughter.

PRISONER COOL IN COURT

Ten Jurymen Secured When Second Venue is Called—Tillamook People Evince Great Interest in the Proceedings.

DALLAS, Or., May 18.—(Special.)—Ten jurymen had been selected in the Ab Hembree murder case this afternoon at 5 o'clock, when adjournment was taken until 9 o'clock tomorrow.

This is the second trial of Ab Hembree, the Southern Tillamook farmer, whose wife and daughter were found dead in the ruins of a barnhouse near Sand Lake, Tillamook County, and who is accused of murdering them and burning the house to conceal his crime.

The prisoner is a well-preserved man for his age, being about 40 years old, and appears to be able to do well the nervous strain of his trial.

Trying McComas for Murder.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 18.—The trial of W. P. McComas, the well-known mining man and clubman, on the charge of murdering Mrs. Charlotte L. Noyes in her apartments on the night of February 23, began here today. McComas shot and killed Mrs. Noyes while they were alone in the room late at night. There were no witnesses to the tragedy. Mrs. Noyes died instantly and McComas telephoned the police of the affair and gave himself up. He was seriously burned about the face with acid, which he says Mrs. Noyes threw upon him. The defense will be that he fired the fatal shot while resisting the frenzied attack of the woman. The murder created a sensation in Los Angeles, where both parties were well known and the trial is being watched with great interest.
