

EFFORT TO DEFER CHAMBERLAIN?

Statement No. 1 Legislators May Shrink Below 46, the Needed Number.

HOW THAT MAY BE DONE

Opponents of Governor Look Around to See if Necessary Votes May Be Withheld—The Crucial Six.

Should three Statement No. 1 Republican Representatives in the Legislature refuse to vote for Chamberlain, Democrat, for United States Senator, on the first day's ballot, Chamberlain would not be elected.

In the Legislature will be 52 Statement No. 1 members, of whom 39 are Republicans. The majority needed to elect the United States Senator is 45.

Should Representative P. H. Bonebrake, of Benton, adhere strictly to his pledge to support for United States Senator the choice of the majority voters, that will absolve him from support of Chamberlain, since Chamberlain did not receive the majority of the votes cast for Senator by the people.

PROHIBITION IS IN DOUBT

Official Count is Necessary to Decide Issue.

CLATSOP PLURALITY IS 357

Returns Are Complete, but Not Official.

ASTORIA, Or., June 3.—(Special.)—Complete unofficial returns for every precinct in Clatsop County give Chamberlain a majority of 357 over Cake for the Senatorship, and give Moore a majority of 17 over Linn for County Commissioner, thus electing the entire Republican Legislative and county tickets.

R. S. Bean has a lead of 23 to 1 over both competitors, Bailey 2 to 1 over Emery. Hawley by a majority of 2 to 1 over R. K. Campbell for Railroad Commissioner and Edwin Bryson for Prosecuting Attorney are polling a big Republican vote.

On the constitutional amendments the raise in Legislators' pay loses heavily; location of state institutions carries slightly; increasing Circuit Judges' salaries slightly; changing time of election carries heavily. The referendum measure that will carry in Lane are 305 and 314. The University bill will have a majority of 1500 or more in Lane.

UMATILLA DRY BY 800 VOTES

Cake's Lead in the County Will Be About 250.

PENDLETON, Or., June 3.—(Special.)—By getting nearly every vote in the outlying precincts, the prohibitionists have increased their lead in Umatilla County 200, to 800, the same vote by which they lost in their fight of four years ago. Cake's lead is 246, with about 76 votes in two small precincts to be accounted for. The ballot boxes are all at the Clerk's office and the official count was started this evening. It will not be completed, however, before tomorrow noon.

GIVES UNIVERSITY BILL 1500

Saloons Stronger in Country Districts Than in Salem.

SALISBURY, Or., June 3.—(Special.)—Complete unofficial returns for Marion County give Cake 216 votes, Chamberlain 206, but there are doubtless inaccuracies in the figures due to difficulty in taking figures over the phone. The university appropriation bill was defeated here by 1500 majority. The official count was commenced today, but will not be completed for two days.

COUNT COMPLETE IN YAMHILL

Chamberlain Is 160 Votes Behind Republican Opponent.

MEMPHISVILLE, Or., June 3.—(Special.)—Complete unofficial returns for Yamhill County give Cake 189 plurality over Chamberlain. Beals, for Joint Senator, has 335 over Laughlin. The vote for other candidates was completed yesterday in not materially affected. Maloney, Democrat, is elected County Recorder over Nickell, Republican, by nine votes.

CHAMBERLAIN STRONG AND COUNTY MAY GO DRY.

OREGON CITY, Or., June 3.—(Special.)—Governor Chamberlain has carried Clackamas County by 510 votes, according to the unofficial returns which are now complete. The Salem Senator, C. J. Smith, Democrat, received 234 and Chamberlain 264. The official count will be made tomorrow and will not change the result, though there is a very slight chance that the count may reverse the vote on Prohibition. The county has apparently gone wet by about 90 votes, and the local opinion here is that the vote will be an official count will disclose enough errors to swing it their way.
