

ADOPT COTTEL BILL

Members of Committee Vote for Spiritualist Ordinance.

VICTORY FOR BARRETT

Opposing Forces Among Spiritualists and Mediums in Lively Tilt Before Council Committee.

The City Council committee on health and police yesterday morning voted to recommend for passage the Cotel ordinance, with amendments suggested by Harrison D. Barrett.

Proceeding the action of the committee, there occurred a lively tilt between the opposing forces of spiritualists.

The action of the committee is a distinct victory for the Barrett side, as it is confidently expected that the ordinance will pass the Council.

When the committee was called to order, Mr. Barrett arose and stated his position in the matter, strongly urging that the ordinance and the amendments be recommended for passage.

Mrs. Selp then addressed the committee, saying that in her judgment, the ordinance as drafted would be defective.

Rev. G. Love, a missionary of the National Spiritualist Society, living in Portland, spoke in favor of the Cotel ordinance, and was promptly and fiercely attacked by William Brooks, a member of the Spiritualist faith.
