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AIR CURE AT THE ASYLUM

PAVILIONS UNDER WAY FOR TUBERCULAR INSANE. State Board of Health Finds Educational Policy Beneficial—Discusses Smallpox Epidemics.

All the members of the State Board of Health were present yesterday at the regular meeting, with the exception of the president, Dr. Alfred Kinney, of Astoria, who was detained at home by illness.

It was announced that the asylum authorities are building open-air pavilions on the grounds for the use of tubercular patients, and that the condition of all the buildings and surroundings is good.

Quite a long discussion was held on the menace of smallpox in various parts of the state, epidemics existing in North Oregon, Ladopette and Monmouth, and last Fall in Eastern Oregon.
