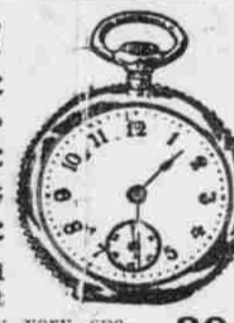

POOREST TRADE ON EARTH

New York Judge Says There Is Little Money In Law.

NEW YORK, June 19.—Judge Hough, of the United States District Court, in addressing the graduating students of the New York Law School at the annual commencement exercises, spoke of the possibilities of the life of a lawyer. His address he called "Vocation and Avocation." He said in part: "That our profession is crowded is of no importance at all. That it is laborious is equally unimportant. You must enter our profession with some searching of heart, with a serious belief in fitness and with willingness to undergo the labor of intellectual life. It is one of the poorest trades on earth and he who cannot assure himself that he will pursue it as a profession and not a trade should retreat before it is too late. If you do not feel within you now that spirit of professional fidelity which transforms the client's interests into yours, the sooner you abandon the law the better."

Tons of Dynamite for Canal. WASHINGTON, June 19.—Vast quantities of dynamite are to be used on the Isthmian canal work during the next fiscal year, according to estimates made by the division engineers. Over 500 tons of the explosives will be required, and nearly 64 per cent of it will be for the use of the Calabaz division. One division, the Chagres will use 30 per cent of the dynamite, which is regarded as a sufficient percentage of strength for medium rock. The plan is to keep only three months' supply of the explosive on the isthmus at one time, thus lessening the danger and loss in case of explosion.

PERSIA IN BAD PLIGHT

Russian Gunboat Enters Port of Enzell on Caspian.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 19.—A dispatch received here from Baku says a Russian gunboat has entered the Persian port of Enzell on the Caspian Sea, but the statement has not been confirmed. The foreign office here is withholding definite advice from Teheran concerning the situation in Persia. It sees but few encouraging symptoms in the present state of anarchy that exists in Persia.

Twenty Injured in Wreck. MEADEVILLE, Pa., June 19.—Twenty passengers were injured, one fatally and several seriously, today in an accident on the Meadeville and Cambridge Springs streetcar line, near Bakertown. A passenger car telescoped a freight car at a sharp curve. The fatally injured person is M. C. Mills, superintendent of the traction line.

PLANS TO KILL GOVERNOR

Insane Woman Goes Gunning for Colorado Executive.

DENVER, June 19.—Through the kindness of Assistant Secretary James E. Dougherty, of the State Humane Society, Governor Henry A. Buchtel escaped probable injury yesterday afternoon at the hands of Mrs. Annie Jochim, an insane woman. Laboring under the delusion that the Governor had got possession of \$40,000 she imagined she was left her by W. S. Stratton and is scheming to force her to marry him, the woman visited the Executive's office with the intention of shooting him with a 32-caliber revolver. Unable to obtain admission to the Executive chamber, the woman went to the Humane Society and made threats to "fix" the Governor.

Health Ruined in Islands. SAN FRANCISCO, June 19.—Captain William Parker, Twenty-fourth Infantry; Lieutenant Charles S. Tarlton, First Infantry, and Lieutenant Joseph Herring, Twenty-fourth Infantry, appeared before the retiring board at the Presidio yesterday for examination regarding conditions for retirement. These officers have been troubled with fever, contracted in the Philippines and have been treated for the last few months at the general hospital at the Presidio.

BEATS UP OLD MAN OF 82

Westfall Marshal Accused of Assault Over Money Matters.

VALER, Or., June 19.—Asa Carey, marshal of Westfall, was brought into Vale under arrest for assault on Dan Brady, of Westfall, Wednesday night. Carey, who is aged about 30, became involved in an altercation with Brady, who is 82, feeble and decrepit with age, over some money matters. Eyewitnesses say that both men had been drinking in the saloon. After some hot words, Carey struck the old man and knocked him down, then kicked him, knocking his teeth out and further maltreated and abused the old man, who now lies in a critical condition. Carey is in the Sheriff's custody.

Dynamite Kills Two Tramps. SARGENT, Colo., June 19.—By the explosion of a carload of dynamite near here today, a freight train on the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad was blown to pieces, two tramps were killed and several tramps were injured, one fatally. A hole 40 feet deep was blown in the ground.

THIRD FLOOD THREATENED

Heavy Rains Cause Renewed Anxiety at Kansas City.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 19.—For the third time in as many weeks, the Missouri and Kaw Rivers have given cause for alarm at this point, and this time a rise of over 2 1/2 feet during the past 24 hours was recorded on the Missouri River gauge.

River Rising at Omaha. OMAHA, June 19.—The Missouri began rising at Omaha again today, and the Weather Bureau predicts a rise of another eight or ten inches by Sunday morning. MASONIC ORACLE IS DEAD

Albert W. Barnard, of Chicago, Was Holder of 200 Degrees.

CHICAGO, June 19.—Gilbert Wadsworth Barnard, well known to the Masonic fraternity of Chicago and the United States, died at his residence here early today after a lingering illness of several months. Heart disease was the cause of death. "Gil" W. Barnard, as he was known to his friends, held more active Masonic offices and had more degrees than any other member of his order so far as is known. His degrees numbered more than 200, a large proportion being conferred by collateral orders. During the last few years of his life Mr. Barnard devoted himself to directing the work of the Masonic bodies of Illinois. He was the active working force in 19 big state bodies, writing reports and directing all the details of the work.

Mr. Barnard was an oracle on matters of precedent and interpretation of Masonic laws. All disputes that could not be settled elsewhere came to him for final judgment. His office was a storehouse of Masonic data. His own connection with Masonry began in 1854. The side of the work which occupied him chiefly, was the spirit

Two Fatally Hurt in Wreck

LOS ANGELES, Cal., June 19.—Two persons were fatally injured and 17 cut and bruised in a rear-end collision of two high-speed Interurban electric cars at Slauson Junction, early today. The fatally injured are George M. Stanton and his wife, of Santa Ana. A heavily laden car bound from Los Angeles for Santa Ana crashed into the rear of a car bound for Whittier, which was almost empty and had stopped at a crossing to take on passengers. A heavy fog in the lowlands obscured the rear red lights of the Whittier car until the Santa Ana car, which was traveling 30 miles an hour, was too close for the air brakes to lessen the speed.
