

KEPT FROM BERTHS
Further Charges Against Captain Babcock, of Sherman.

CHORUS GIRLS FAVORED
Three of Them, Also Whisky Drummer, Said to Have Been Taken Care Of, While Soldiers Had to Sleep on Deck.

Ex-soldiers and many enlisted men are still protesting vigorously against the treatment they received at the hands of Captain Babcock, quartermaster-captain of the transport Sherman, which recently brought a regiment of infantry from the Philippines to Vancouver barracks.

They charge that Captain Babcock favored certain passengers to the great discomfort of themselves. As many as three dozen, it is said by the soldiers, were absolutely denied berths until after the ship had passed Nagasaki. At that point such a protest was raised that the captain was forced to grant them use of the remaining berths. Those who were unable to secure berths were forced to sleep either upon the deck or in the hold.

BOOKMAKERS SENT TO JAIL
Denver Judge Terms His Offense as Pernicious Gambling.

DENVER, June 26.—In the Criminal Court today Judge George W. Allen fined W. E. Everhart \$100 and costs and sentenced him to serve six months in jail for violating the gambling law by making a book on the races at Overland Park last week. The jail sentence was remitted. Notice of an appeal to the Supreme Court was given. In passing sentence Judge Allen declared that bookmaking was "the most pernicious form of gambling."
