WALTON'S BAIL REDUCED

Cut by Court From \$10,000 to \$7500, but Is Still Too High.

The bail of Charles W. Walton, the young musician who held up a William Heights streetcar in the Autumn of 1904, and shot Policeman O. Nelson, has been reduced from \$10,000 to \$7500.

This was the order of Judge Cleland, in the Circuit Court yesterday morning, before he left for a three weeks vacation at Seaside. Upon the shooting charge, upon which Walton was recently convicted for the second time, the bail was fixed at \$5000, and on the house charge it was fixed at \$2500.

After consultation with District Attorney Cameron, Attorney Dan R. Murphy, counsel for Walton, had asked that the bail be reduced, but was not in court when the order was made. He said last night that he does not think Walton will be able to raise this amount of bail among his friends, in which case he will remain in jail.
