ADMITTS PLAGUE EXISTS

CARACAS, Saturday, June 27.—At last Caracas officially has the plague and the credit for having fully brought it to the attention of the government is due to the initiative shown by the German Minister, Baron de Seckendorff, who presented a note to Minister of Foreign Affairs, Mr. de la Torre, on June 24.

FEWER FREIGHT CARS IDLE

DECREASE OF 46,720 IN TWO WEEKS ENDING JUNE 24.

American Railway Association Gives Out Encouraging Report—New England Shows Increase.

CHICAGO, July 8.—The report of the American Railway Association, giving the number of freight cars in the country on June 24, shows that during the two weeks ending June 24, there was a decrease of 46,720 in the number of surplus freight cars.

The improvement was by no means uniform the country over. In the New England states there was an increase in the number of idle cars, while the middle western states showed substantial decrease.

The decrease reported is the fourth consecutive decrease in two months, or a total reduction of 104,812 idle freight cars.

The resumption of mining in parts of the bituminous coal fields, which were idle for most of the month of April, was the first important factor which operated toward a decrease in the number of idle cars.
