Columbia River Salmon Canners Are Encouraged.

FISH RUN HAS BEEN HEAVY

Pack to Date Is 20 Per Cent Larger Than at This Time a Year Ago.

Foreign Demand for Red Alaska.

The canned salmon situation, so far as the Columbia River output is concerned, looks better than it has for three or four years past.

The heavy run began about ten days ago, and more fish were caught than in any similar period for two years past.

The feature of the general salmon situation, as reported by the latest Eastern advices, is the strong inquiry for spot red Alaska fish for shipment to England.
