OREGON CITY, Or., July 21.—(Special).—Francis Harry Bauer, the son of B. H. Bauer, a carpenter employed by Marshall Bros., who have the contract for the extension work on the new building at Old Station A., for the Hawley Pulp & Paper Company, was drowned this afternoon. He was in bathing with two other young men, when he got beyond his depth and, while trying to swim, sank out of sight. He was under water 15 minutes, when one of the workmen recovered his body by diving. The boy's mother died almost two years ago. Bauer came up here from Portland recently and his son was going to work on the Hawley construction tomorrow morning.
