MILLIONAIRES ARE ALARMED

INCENDIARY FIRES WORRY LONG ISLAND PLUTOCRATS.

Owners of Fine Homes Discuss Organization of Vigilance Committee to Punish Firebug.

NEW YORK, July 30.—So many fires, clearly of incendiary origin, have occurred within the last two weeks up to and including today, in what are known as the "millionaire colonies" of Greater Neck, Manhasset, Fort Washington and other towns in the North Hempstead district of Long Island that radical measures have been determined upon and there is earnest talk of formation of a vigilance committee to run down and inflict summary punishment.

PENSION BILL AMENDED

Lords Make Changes That Commons Will Reject.

LONDON, July 30.—The House of Lords passed today the old age pensions bill, with several amendments, which will be rejected by the House of Commons. There is little doubt that the Lords will acquiesce in the rejections when the measure is returned to them.

Youth Kills His Girl Bride.

LEBANON, Ohio, July 30.—Infuriated because she had filed suit for the annulment of her marriage, Grover Wiloughby, 21 years old, an employee of the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad, shot and killed his 17-year-old bride of less than a week almost at her mother's feet yesterday, and a moment later sent a bullet through his own heart, falling dead a few yards from the body of his wife.

Negro Pastor Steals \$20,000.

NATCHEZ, Miss., July 30.—James Crossgrove, negro minister of this city, has been arrested, charged with embezzlement of \$20,000 of the funds of the Independent Daughters of Charity of America. In default of \$2,000 bond he was sent to jail.

CORTELYOU FOR GOVERNOR

NEW YORK LEADERS PROPOSED HIM AGAINST HUGHES.

Threw Out Feeler Before Governor Announced Candidacy, but Got No Answer.

NEW YORK, July 30.—Gossip has been in circulation in this city for several days to the effect that George B. Cortelyou, Secretary of the Treasury, would allow the use of his name as a candidate for nomination on the Republican ticket for Governor against Charles E. Hughes. The gossip apparently had no basis in any statements made by Mr. Cortelyou or his friends.

It is said that some of the members of the state organization approached Mr. Cortelyou before Mr. Hughes announced his willingness to accept a re-nomination, and these leaders asked Mr. Cortelyou whether he would be willing to become a candidate if further consideration indicated his probable nomination. It is understood that the nomination was definitely offered to Mr. Cortelyou. Mr. Cortelyou gave no explicit reply to these suggestions, but promised to consider the matter.

Today the Evening Post published the statement that it is highly improbable that Mr. Cortelyou will allow the use of his name.

Japan Planning Maneuvers.

TOKIO, Friday, July 31.—It is stated that owing to the postponement of the completion of the battleships Aki and Satsuma and the cruisers Ibuki and Kurama will be deferred until a later date, but the repairs of the ships captured during the war with Russia will be pushed forward rapidly, so that they will be able to take their place among the vessels to engage in the naval maneuvers this Autumn. Ten battleships, 13 armored cruisers, nine second-class cruisers, eight third-class cruisers, five coast defense ships, four gunboats, eight dispatch boats, two submarine destroyers, seven submarines, 14 torpedo-boat destroyers, 16 first-class torpedo-boats and 55 second and third-class torpedo-boats will take part in the maneuvers.

Leg Broken in Brawl.

Garfield Sees Utah Projects.

SALT LAKE CITY, July 30.—Secretary of the Interior James R. Garfield spent yesterday studying the progress that has been made on the Strawberry Valley reclamation project, which includes the diverting of the waters of Spanish Fork Canyon into the head of the Government canal. About 60,000 acres of land will be reclaimed. Secretary Garfield was accompanied by Governor John C. Cutler, Senator Sutherland, Director F. H. Newell, of the reclamation service, and other state and Government officials. The secretary is on his annual tour of inspection and review of the Government reclamation work in the West. Late last night he left for Montrose, Colo., to look at the reclamation work being done there.

The decrease in shipbuilding in the United Kingdom is the greatest, according to the London Financial Times, in a quarter of a century. The tonnage now under construction is 101,000 less than at the end of last quarter, and 450,000 less than that of 13 months ago.
