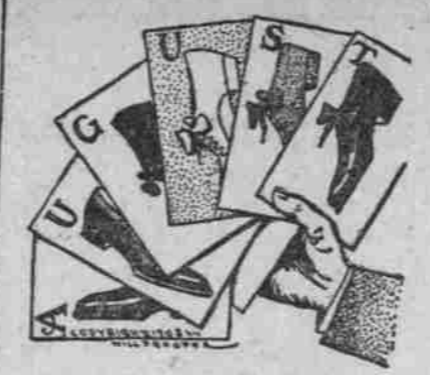

regarding the sale of infected fruit (whether wet, scabby or scabby) is to be enforced this year.

The apple crop in the vicinity of Hubbard is light this year and Mr. Armstrong admitted while here that the crop is practically the whole country is the same.

While there was great profusion of blossoms in the Spring, there was a light setting of fruit and the June drop has lessened the crop still more.

Many orchardists think the cold rains during the blossoming period had a direct injurious effect, while others think the rains prevented the bees and other insects from properly distributing the pollen.

The codling moth has made less trouble this year than usual and those who have sprayed regularly have clean fruit so far. However, in this part of the valley much of the injury is done by the second brood which will begin to hatch in a few days.
