

LARGE FLEET OF COASTERS ARRIVES

Pilots Have Busy Time With Steamers Which Reach Port in One Day.

ALL AMERICAN VESSELS

Week Which Will End August 15 Will Close to Record for Number of Steam Vessels Handled.

ASTORIA, Or., Aug. 12.—(Special.)—The pilot schooner Joseph Pulteney signalled this morning that a steam schooner bound south had reported a four-masted bark anchored close in shore about 16 miles above North Head. The tug Tootash immediately cruised 15 miles up the coast, but could find no trace of the vessel, so she is supposed to have refloated and put off shore. The name of the bark is not known.
