CITIZENS CHASE BURGLAR

EXCITING PURSUIT OF ARMED MAN ON EAST SIDE.

Fugitive Draws Knife and Races Over Many Streets Until He Falls Exhausted.

Fifty East Side residents, aroused by the operations and attempted escape of a daylight burglar, captured him early yesterday afternoon, and turned him over to the police. The chase continued for 12 blocks, the burglar keeping his pursuers off with a pocket knife. Finally, H. H. Olson, of 24 North Twentieth street, East, grappled with the fugitive, threw him and held him down until an officer came. Joseph O'Brien, a transient, is the burglar. He was robbing the home of Patrolman Fred Mallett at the corner of East Thirty-first and East Burnside streets when discovered by Mrs. Lillian Abbott, of 18 East Thirty-first street, who sounded the alarm. O'Brien saw people gathering about the house and ran out the doorway, trusting to his speed to make his escape. He did not have a pistol but drew a pocket knife with which to intimidate any who might follow. A dozen persons were at his heels and the number was continually increasing until, at the close of the race, 50 pursuers were behind O'Brien. Several caught up with him but hesitated on closing in because of the knife. Olson took up the race and went after

O'Brien in earnest. The race had proceeded by an indirect route to East Thirty-second and Alder streets before Olson caught O'Brien. The latter was out of breath and all but exhausted. He made no show of resistance. Patrolman Robson took O'Brien to the city jail. Later, Reuben Beal, a young man who had been seen talking with O'Brien earlier in the day, was arrested as a suspect. The Mallett home was ransacked but little was taken. Mallett and his family are on a vacation trip to the Coast.

G. A. COURSEN IS DEAD

Father of Portland Residents Passes Away in San Francisco.

Gerson A. Coursen, father of Professor E. E. Coursen and Mrs. Walter Reed, of Portland, died at his residence in San Francisco, 1050 Fulton street, yesterday, at the age of 84 years. As Mr. Coursen had enjoyed good health up to a few days ago when his children last heard from him, it is presumed that a breakdown due to age was the immediate cause of his death. Mr. Coursen came to the Coast with the pioneers of California. He followed in the stock brokerage business and in the Commodore days amassed two or three fortunes at different times. The homestead on Fulton street is one of the most notable old-time residences in the Bay City. Mrs. Reed left for San Francisco last night to attend the funeral of her father. STILL SEARCH FOR PENCE

OFFICIALS WANT EXPLANATION OF \$10,000 BONDS.

Ex-Congressman Declares He Is Not in Hiding and Has Valuable Stock Security.

The constable's force is still looking for Lafe Pence, promoter and erstwhile Congressman, from Colorado. Constable Wagner has one of his deputies doing little of anything else. They want Pence to step into court and describe the property he holds having a valuation of \$10,000. But Pence seems to have a faculty of not being visible to the authorities. Pence will not be taken into custody when located. He will merely be made the subject of a summons in supplemental proceedings. He will have five days in which to explain to the court the nature of his property, for, as previously explained, he signed a bond of \$10,000 for the release of 12-year-old Jackson Reid, the slayer of George De Mars whereas judgments for about \$100 against him remain unsatisfied for the sufficient reason that the Sheriff has never been able to locate tangible Pence property in Multnomah County. "If the Sheriff or Constable wants to find me," said Lafe Pence last night, "I'll have to do it to call at Twenty-eighth and Thurman. When he gets there he will see the sign of the Pence

SHIP WHISKY TO INDIANS

LOCAL DEALERS SAID TO SUPPLY SILETZ BRAVES.

Federal Prosecution May Follow Unless Intent of Law is Evaded Through Technicality.

Federal authorities suspect certain Portland saloon dealers of furnishing Indians on the Siletz Reservation with whiskey and arrests may follow an investigation that is being made. It is charged that liquor dealers in this city regularly ship intoxicants to redskins, who carry it into the reservation. Under the Federal statutes it is a crime to ship liquor into an Indian reservation, but it is said the saloon dealers avoid violating the statute technically by shipping the liquor to Toledo, which is outside the reservation and from which it is carried onto the Government's land by the Indians, who receive it at the railroad station. Assistant United States Attorney Evans yesterday filed with United States Commissioner Cannon two complaints, each charging Warren Brainard, an Indian, with unlawfully carrying liquor on the Siletz Reservation. An officer has gone to Lincoln County to make the arrest. Brainard is one of the Indians who is said to obtain his whiskey from saloon men in this city.
