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REGULARS LEAD IN SKIRMISH MATCH

Excel All State Organizations in Championship Shoot at Camp Perry.

OREGON MEN STAND WELL

Only Oklahoma, Massachusetts and Colorado Regiments Make Higher Scores - Second Washington Falls Down in Cup Race.

CAMP PERRY, O., Aug. 17.-(Special.)

In the championship regimental skirmish match of the National Rifle Association tournament today, 40 teams competing, the Fourth Oregon Regiment won tenth place and the Third Regiment thirteenth place.

Three important matches were scheduled for today, being the regimental skirmish, the Wimbledon cup shoot and the regimental team match.

In the skirmish match between 49 teams of six men each, the regulars took the first three places, the honors going to the corps of engineers, with a score of 460; the marine corps second, with 452, and the Naval Academy third, with 238.

The Second Washington, which was first last year, finished 18th today. This event must be won three years in succession before the cup can be held.

The scores in the regimental team match were not compiled tonight by the officials and the standings are not known.

TWO MEN KILLED IN WRECK

Silver Sticking, Denver Horse, Goes Distance in 58 3-5 at Meadows.

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 17.-Silver Sticking, a 4-year-old, man owned by G. Bedwell, a Denver horseman, today equaled the world's record for five furlongs at the Meadows, running the distance in 58 3-5, carrying 100 pounds. The track has been remarkably fast all season.
