

CRIMES INCREASE, THE ONE OF LAWYER

Members of American Bar Association Listen to Statistics.

FOUR-YEAR COURSE URGED

Dean of School at Yale Causes Brisk Debate on Question of Term of Study Before Practice.

SEATTLE, Aug. 26.—Before the American Bar Association this evening Frederick Bauman, of Seattle, discussed the question, "Are Our Laws Responsible for the Increase of Violent Crime?"

Taking the crime of murder as the basis for the discussion, he gave statistics showing that 9000 homicides had occurred during the past year, the largest number in any other civilized country, save only Mexico and Russia.

He found two causes for the latter fact, one the fact itself with which the courts permit appeals and delays and the other, the sentiment of the American public toward murderers.

Need Death Penalty.

In these two cases, however, he believed the death penalty should be retained, because the people were willing to enforce it, and the offenders, being professional criminals, required the terror of death to deter them.

A sharp debate was precipitated in the session during the afternoon by the report of Henry W. Rogers, dean of the Yale University Law School, and chairman of the committee on legal education, and admissions to the bar.

Reports on Laws.

The feature of the morning's session was an address by George Turner, formerly United States Senator from Washington, the rest of the day being devoted to the reports of standing committees on jurisprudence and law reform.

Law Schools Resign.

At the meeting of the Association of American Law Schools, held in connection with the American Bar Association convention, resolutions were adopted limiting the membership in the association to such schools as grant diplomas only on the completion of a full three years' course of study.
