NORTHWEST DEATH ROLL

Pioneer Who Crossed the Plains in the Sixties Dies.

KENT, Wash., Aug. 25.—(Special.)—At his home near Kent Jacob Rieth died August 22. He was born in Alsace, then a part of France, February 24, 1838.

He came with his parents to America when he was very young.

Mr. Rieth crossed the plains from Minnesota in 1853 by way of the old Oregon trail.

In Southern Idaho the party was surprised and attacked by Indians. Many were killed and the rest fled and were separated.

After taking the emigrants' wagons, provisions and ammunition, the Indians were content and did not molest the remaining members of the party.

This is known as the Van Norman massacre.

LaFayette Pioneer Dead.

LAFAYETTE, Or., Aug. 25.—(Special.)—George Marion Perkins, a pioneer of 1852 and for many years a resident of Lafayette, died at his home in this city this morning.

Mr. Perkins was born in Illinois in 1814, and with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George W. Perkins, crossed the plains in the train captained by William Perkins.

He was a member of one of the most widely-known families of the early Oregon days and for many years was an active participant in the affairs of the county.

He is survived by his father, three sisters and two brothers.
