VANCOUVER PLANS CELEBRATION IN HONOR OF EVENT.

Clark County Metropolitan Sees Completion of Trolley System in Growing City.

VANCOUVER, Wash., Sept. 17.—(Special.)—The Vancouver Traction Company, which owns the street railway system in Vancouver, has announced that it expects to open the electric line the first part of next week.

The citizens of Vancouver, in consequence, are arranging to celebrate the event with one of the biggest civic demonstrations ever held here. The first cars to run over the line—as many of them as can be secured—will carry 4,000 of prominent citizens and their wives out to the end of the line in the northern part of the city, where public exercises will be held, following this, a banquet will be held in the evening.

There are now laid within the city limits two and one-half miles of track, the line running north on Main street from the river, with a branch line on Eleventh street to the new station of the North Bank Railroad. The trolley wires are all up and everything is in readiness for the cars, which are expected to reach here on Saturday, September 19. These cars having been shipped from St. Louis.

The Electric Railway Company is at work now extending the electric line into the country to the northeast of Vancouver, the line being now projected as far as the St. John road. The car barns are to be located a short distance beyond the Armada Park Addition to the city.
