Frytag, of Gladstone; T. L. Turner, of Tualatin, and Mrs. Frances J. Wells, of Portland, were the judges. After inspection by the audience, the school children and the judges the following awards were made:

Prettiest baby under 6 months and under 2 years old—Margaret Blum, second, John P. Riley, Fattest baby—First prize, Evaline Dale Dowling, second, Robert Bell. Brightest, brightest and best natured—First prize, Eva Murray, second, Catherine "Scott" third, Agatha Kewley. Consolation prizes were then given the remainder of the babies.

The Grange is furnishing refreshments.
