MAYOR NAMES TWO

Seneca Smith and John Montag Join Executive Board.

THREE VACANCIES REMAIN

Will Be Filled Soon, and Then Assignments of Committees Will Be Made—Montag Served Lane Before.

When a special session of the City Executive Board was called to order by Mayor Lane yesterday afternoon, Judge Seneca Smith and John Montag were present as members.

Both were appointed yesterday by the Mayor to fill vacancies caused by recent resignations. They participated in the proceedings of the session, at which the monthly payroll was passed and other minor business was transacted.

John Montag was formerly a member of the Executive Board and resigned because it became known that he violated a rule of the charter by signing regulations on his own establishment, a stove manufacturing concern.

He set up the defense that he did not know he was violating any section of the charter, but it was deemed wise by him and Mayor Lane at the time that Mr. Montag should quit the board. Therefore, when he resigned, the Mayor promptly accepted the resignation.

That Mayor Lane should again appoint Mr. Montag to a place on the board caused the past week a surprise throughout official circles, but Mayor Lane thought that Mr. Montag is too valuable a man for the city to have in its service to allow the mistake once made to stand in the way, and consequently reappointed his former associate.
