Court Informs Grand Jury as to Control of County Prisoners.

CUSTODY WITH SHERIFF

He Must Notify County Court When Prisoners Are Available for Work—Court's Duty Is to Direct Labor.

The question of the custody of county prisoners, which has long been a bone of contention between Sheriff Stevens and the County Court, was settled yesterday afternoon, when the September grand jury filed in before Presiding Judge Gantenbein, in the Circuit Court, and asked that he construe for them the law passed by the Legislature in 1907.
