RIDICULE ON REPUBLICANS

CEEDAR RAPIDS, Ia., Oct. 6.—I present myself as an example of one who has outlived the venomous attacks of his opponents.

At Woodward he heaped ridicule on the Republicans by charging them with taking credit for the growth of crops, the shining of the sun and the falling of rain.

TURKEY APPEALS TO POWERS

WILLING TO YIELD TO CONFERENCE, BUT WANTS BULGARIA DISCIPLINED.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 6.—The Council of Ministers held a long session this morning to consider the action of Bulgaria in declaring her independence of Turkey at Timovo yesterday.

REPLYING TO THE TERMS SENT TO THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT BY PRINCE FERDINAND, IN WHICH HE SAID IN DECLARING THE INDEPENDENCE OF BULGARIA HE HAD BEEN COMPELLED TO RESPECT THE VOICE OF THE NATION AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE FRIENDLY RELATIONS BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES WOULD CONTINUE, TURKEY SAYS SHE HAS INVITED THE POWERS TO CONFER ON THE SUBJECT AND AS HER RIGHTS ARE GUARANTEED BY THE POWERS SHE WILL LOOK TO THEM FOR THEIR DEFENSE.

According to this same journal, Austria-Hungary has informed the powers of her intention of withdrawing her troops from the Sanjak of Novi-Bazar.

RUSSIA TO CALL CONFERENCE

PROTESTED AGAINST BULGARIA'S ACTION, BUT OPPOSES WAR.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 6.—The intention of Russia to convolve a congress of the powers to consider the violation of the treaty of Berlin was the subject of lengthy conferences yesterday between Acting Minister of Foreign Affairs Tschiryski and the diplomatic representatives of the powers interested.

When the Foreign Office was sounded in the matter of the Bulgarian proclamation it addressed strongly worded representations to Prince Ferdinand against the step, declaring it to be the duty of civilized powers to refrain from producing a precedent.

COLORADO PRESENTED WITH SILVER PLATE BY STATE.

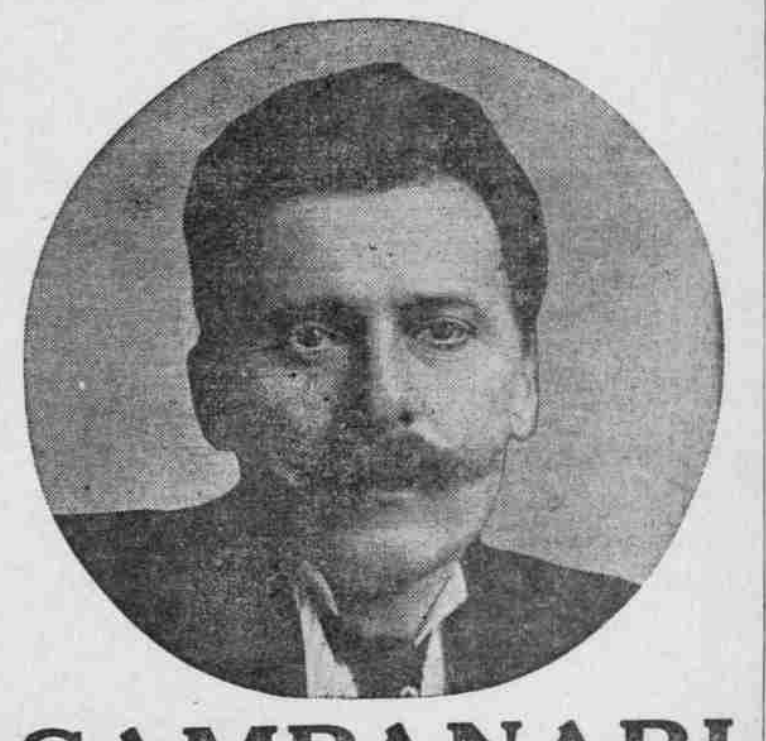
