BIG RALLY TONIGHT

Political Address by Judge Thompson at Armory.

WELL KNOWN AS ORATOR

Attendance at Republican Meeting Is Expected to Rival Great Crowd That Heard Beveridge Open Campaign.

C. N. McArthur, secretary of the Republican state central committee, yesterday announced that he had secured the Armory for the rally to be held tonight when Judge Will H. Thompson, of Seattle, will deliver a political address on "Injunctions and Decisions." Judge Thompson will arrive in the city this morning and during his stay here will be entertained by members of the local bar. Tomorrow night he will deliver another address before the voters of Forest Grove. Judge Thompson is recognized as one of

the most eloquent orators on the Pacific Coast and there is every assurance that his audience will rival that which greeted Senator Beveridge a week ago. In view of the fact that his address will deal principally with the subject of injunctions, the laboring men of Portland are especially invited to attend the meeting. Secretary McArthur yesterday named the following committee from the Portland Bar Association which will entertain Judge Thompson while he is in the city: James Kerr, B. R. Bekkaman, Lawrence A. McNary and W. D. Fenton.

Furuseth to Address Unions. Organized labor of this city is making extensive arrangements for its anti-Taft anti-injunction demonstration which will be held in the Armory tomorrow night. The meeting promises to be one of the largest labor gatherings in the history of the city. Andrew Furuseth, Congressional lobbyist for the American Federation of Labor at Washington for the last 15 years, will be the principal speaker. Other addresses will be delivered by C. O. Young, Pacific Coast organizer of the American Federation of Labor and George H. Howell, of the Portland Typographical Union. A band has been engaged to furnish music.

Taft Rallies Throughout County. Major J. P. Kennedy, chairman of the Multnomah County Republican central committee, formally opened the campaign in this county yesterday. It is proposed by Chairman Kennedy to arrange for numerous rallies throughout the county during the ensuing three weeks. The services of various local campaign speakers have been volunteered. The headquarters of the

county central committee will be located in suite 200 of the Chamber of Commerce building, in conjunction with the state and National committees.

DOLLIVER DATE IS CANCELED

Iowa Senator Cannot Come to Oregon at This Time. Word was received at Republican headquarters yesterday from the National committee to the effect that the meeting scheduled for Senator Jonathan P. Dolliver at Salem for Friday night of this week has been cancelled. It is understood that the change in Senator Dolliver's itinerary was made necessary owing to the illness of Senator Beveridge, and that the Iowa man will complete Senator Beveridge's itinerary through the Middle Western States.

After his meeting in San Francisco, Senator Dolliver will go to Reno, Nevada, where he will take up the itinerary of Senator Beveridge, whose illness has necessitated his retirement temporarily from the campaign platform. Secretary McArthur will endeavor later in the campaign to arrange for an address by the Iowa Senator at the Capital City.

POLITICS HURTS THEATERS

SHOW BUSINESS POOR IN EAST, SAYS JOHN CORT.

Coast Magnate Is Confident That Conditions Will Improve With Election of Taft.

John Cort, boss theatrical magnate of the Pacific Coast, and the one man west of the Mississippi to whom the big New York managers take off their hats, was in the city yesterday, in company with Mrs. Cort, on their way from an Eastern trip to their home in Seattle. Mr. Cort spent considerable time in New York and Boston studying the theatrical situation, and arranging for his various road productions. "Things theatrical are in a bad way in the East," said Mr. Cort. "Not only our business, but every line is seriously affected by the campaign. Everything seems to be in the air pending the election. When Taft is chosen as President, as he certainly will be, there will be a general advance movement. A month ago it looked as if Bryan had a chance, but the developments of the last few weeks have eliminated Bryan from the running. In my opinion, Taft's election is certain. We took straw votes on all the trains from New York to Portland, and the result showed at least seven out of 10 votes for the big man from Ohio." Mr. Cort's attractions, Florence Rob-

erts and Max Figman, in their new play, "Commencement Days," and many other attractions, in which "the big chief" is interested, have already opened or will soon commence the season of Western touring, which promises to be entirely successful.

Mr. Cort has been in almost continuous conference with his partner, Calvin Heilig and others interested in theatrical matters, during his stay here. Suggest of all in connection with his visit is, however, the announcement that there are no new developments in regard to a new modern theater for Portland. And that is the chief item in which local theatergoers are interested.
