

# ALBERT RICKMERS TAKES PART CARGO

## German Ship Carries Wheat and Will Finish at San Francisco.

# LUMBER FROM CALIFORNIA

## Vessel Was Chartered for Mixed Cargo for Europe — 37,428 Bushels of Wheat Were Taken From This Port.

The German ship Albert Rickmers, which has been in the local harbor since early in June, and was recently chartered for Portland and San Francisco loading of mixed cargo, cleared for Europe yesterday via San Francisco. The ship carried 37,428 bushels of wheat, 112,500 bushels of barley and 13,000 barrels of flour. Reducing the wheat to a wheat basis the total cargo for foreign countries amounts to 1,192,962 bushels.

# FRENCH SAILOR BADLY HURT
