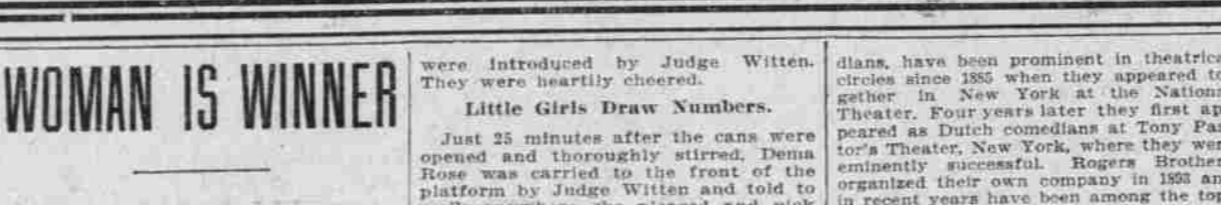

## PUTS W. J. ON GRILL

Bryanism Hazardous Experiment, Says Wright.

## BANK FUND ONLY A FAD

Characterizes Scheme Latest Offspring of Proliferous Brain—Assumes Haskell Would Be Secretary of Treasury.

NEW YORK, Oct. 19.—Seldom has W. J. Bryan been so severely arraigned during the political campaign as he was here tonight by Luke E. Wright, Secretary of War, who addressed a large mass meeting at Terrace Garden. Wright, who was introduced as "a Democrat having the honor of holding a Cabinet position under a Republican Administration," was greeted with enthusiastic cheering when he appeared on the platform.

## Not a Hired Man.

By way of preliminary, Secretary Wright made some observations on what he said Mr. Bryan had on several occasions declared that the President of the United States is merely the "hired man" of the people. While such a statement may tickle the groundlings, the Secretary said, it makes the rightous grieves. In no proper sense, the Secretary added, is he a hired man of the people. The omission of the Democratic party platform to declare for revenue only, Secretary Wright said, was not accidental, but was intended to present a plank upon which Democratic free-traders and protectionists alike could stand. The Secretary said: "I say this because it is a matter of common notoriety that there is a very little Democratic party which favors reasonable protection to American industries. We know that there are many thousands who habitually vote the Democratic ticket who, in the Eastern states especially are for moderate protection, called by whatever name you please, and we know also that in the other great sections of the country the Democratic vote is in favor of a continuation in some form or other of the protective policy. It must also not be overlooked that there exists a strong feeling among the masses of the Republican voters that many of our schedules are too high and should be immediately lowered.

## Unsettled Interests.

The real question, the Secretary said, was which of the two candidates could best be relied upon to make an honest revision. He was persuaded, he declared, that if Mr. Bryan's influence is controlling he can give direction to tariff legislation, the strong probability there will be an unsettling of all the large interests of the country, while Mr. Taft, he said, would not impose upon the shoulders of that great mass of the American people who are consumers and who chiefly pay the freight, any unconscionable burdens.
