CHIPPewa FALLS, Wis., Oct. 28.—The Chicago-Duluth Limited passenger train west bound, jumped the

track near Augusta, Wis., today. A number of passengers and trainmen were injured, but none seriously. The escape from fatalities seemed almost miraculous, as the train was going 40 miles an hour. The engine turned a complete somersault and all the cars tipped over.

DITCH COMPANY IS FORMED

Grants Pass Anxious to Secure Irrigation Project.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Oct. 29.—(Special)—An enthusiastic and earnest meeting was held in the opera-house yesterday

in the interest of an irrigation project for this part of Rogue River Valley. Much work was done by the committee of 14 citizens, and it was the report of this committee that the people were eager to hear. H. L. Gilkey, of the First National Bank, as chairman of that committee, told briefly what had been accomplished and what could be obtained under the present conditions and

among other things that the committee had seen fit to organize under the name of Josephine County Irrigation & Power Company. At the close of the committee's report, stock was offered in shares of \$100 and without hesitation the entire aisle of the opera-house was filled, from the stage to the rear, by business men, professional men, fruitraisers and farmers, ready to subscribe for the amount of

stock offered. In several instances business men who were not present authorized their names to be listed for shares of stock. The corporation was organized for \$10,000 and stock was subscribed to the amount of \$2600.

The officers of the company will proceed at once to secure an expert engineer to prepare information as to what would be the most feasible plan and the cost of promoting the work.
