EDWIN BENNETT OBLIGED BY COURT TO MARRY OWN WIFE

Inability to Produce Certificate Causes Trouble to Couple Who Were United Four Years Ago by Mormon Elder.

Marriage certificates should be kept framed and in a prominent and conspicuous place these days. Edwin Bennett had to marry his own wife, yesterday morning, because he hadn't any certificate. He was married four years ago to Ora Mosgrove, the ceremony being performed by a Mormon elder. The couple didn't know it was necessary to secure a certificate and omitted that part of the ceremony, although they secured the elder's receipt. Bennett and his wife were out late Saturday night when encountered by a member of the Moral Squad. They explained that they were man and wife and said they could prove it by all their neighbors in South Portland. But when asked if they could show a certificate the couple admitted that they had nothing more than a Mormon elder's receipt. They were taken to the Police Station and required to furnish bail. Yesterday morning they were on hand before Municipal Judge Van Zante and had several of their neighbors with them. During the past four years they had been laboring under the impression that they were duly and formally married, they said, and all their neighbors had known them as man and wife and received them as such. "It seems the most absurd thing in the world to say now that we are not married simply because we haven't a regular form of certificate," said Mrs. Bennett. "We were married with ceremony in the pres-

ALL IN LINE AT 7 P. M. MAY CAST BALLOTS.

County Clerk Fields Advises Election Boards to Aid Belated Citizens.

In order that hundreds of voters in this city and county may have an opportunity to vote today, County Clerk Fields has advised the members of the various election boards to permit every man to vote who is in line at his proper voting place at 7 P. M. Tuesday. At a meeting yesterday the executive committee of the Democratic State Central Committee adopted a resolution requesting the mills and factories to give their employes a two-hour holiday today in order to insure as full a vote as possible. The resolution proposed that the work be excused at 4 o'clock this afternoon instead of 6. After the resolution had been adopted, it was submitted to Secretary McArthur, of the Republican organization, who joined in the request.
KLICKITAT IS AROUSED
Meeting to Be Held at White Salmon in Interest of Publicity.
To follow to the work of arousing Klickitat County to carry on publicity work during the coming year, Tom Richardson, manager of the Portland Commercial Club, and H. M. Adams, general freight and passenger agent for the North Bank road, will go to White Salmon Saturday, November 14, and hold a rally. Both will make addresses showing the benefits of community advertising. The meeting at White Salmon is for the purpose of getting that section of the Klickitat country to co-operate with Goldendale, which has already pledged itself to publicity work for the coming year.
