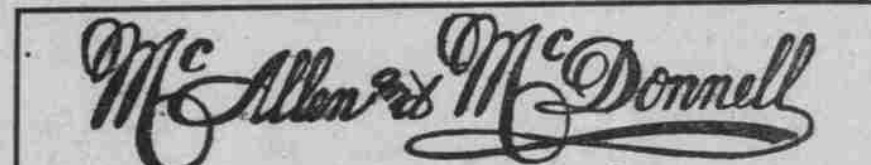

TAFT VOTE GROWS

Oregon Will Return Handsome Republican Plurality.

MAKING OFFICIAL COUNT

Outside of Multnomah, Marion County Gives Largest Vote, Final Count Showing Lead of 1582 Over Bryan.

As official returns come in from the various counties of the state, Taft's plurality continues to grow, and it is almost certain that the first night's estimate of 26,000 will be verified. Bryan's vote in each county exceeds that for Parker four years ago, and even Taft has in many instances received a bigger vote than that accorded Roosevelt. The November vote was not so heavy as that cast at the June election.

BIG GAIN OVER PARKER'S VOTE

Taft Also Gets More Than Roosevelt Did in Washington County.

HILLSBORO, Or., Nov. 5.—(Special).—The official count was completed today and the figures give Taft 2329, Bryan 1165, Chaffin 132, Debs 138, Hlgen 18. Taft's plurality is 1174 as against Roosevelt's plurality above Parker, of 184. Bryan's vote gain above Parker's vote 67, and Taft ran 43 votes ahead of Roosevelt. The prohibition vote shows a loss of 21 compared with the 1902 vote, and the Socialist vote is one less than in that year. The net gain of Bryan, compared to Parker's figures, and giving Taft the 43 of a gain on Roosevelt, is 630.
