## DENIES IMPUTATIONS MADE

### POSTMASTER MINTO EXPLAINS AWAY CERTAIN TESTIMONY.

Says Negro Porter Gave Him Written Order to Hold Out \$16 From Salary to Pay Debt.

Gus Waterford, the negro porter who was once employed in the Postoffice, and who testified Thursday night during the Straus hearing, before United States Commissioner Cannon, that while he was employed at the Postoffice Mr. Minto had deducted \$18 a month out of his salary, but could not remember what for, has not as good a memory as Postmaster Minto. The way Waterford gave his testimony would leave the impression that the money deducted was a sort of graft, and this Postmaster Minto keenly resents. It is said Waterford knew when he testified why the money was taken out of his salary and he knew that it went to pay a doctor's bill and he also knew that he had given the Postmaster a written order to withhold the \$18 from his salary.

and with the advice and consent of the inspectors, and supposing that the money was in the bank, Mr. Shipley and myself instructed Miss Bolman to charge this amount off on her books, which made the stock account and the books balance. She had put these figures in in red ink. I insisted that she put them in in black ink, the same as other transactions in the book, so that it would appear as a legitimate transaction, which it was. There were no figures erased or changed. I remarked at the time that I did not want the books to show to the inspectors as though we were in any way tampering with the accounts, but they should show a proper transaction. Miss Bolman so marked the books. That is all there is in regard to the erasures or changing of figures referred to in the report of Thursday's investigation.

I notice that August Waterford testified that I retained a part of his salary for several months against his will. He also stated that he did not know what I did with it. This is absolutely untrue, as can be easily proved.

Waterford was compelled to go to the hospital and undergo an operation. Dr. Kenney performed the operation; and after Waterford was well and had returned to his work he sent me the bill for the operation. This bill, in which the order stipulated that I was to hold for Dr. Kenney \$18 a month until his bill of about \$20 was paid. This I did, and not a cent of money was ever retained by me for any other purpose.

Dr. Kenney made the following statement regarding the money held out from Waterford's salary each month: That the public may know the facts I wish to correct some statements made by Gus Waterford. In his testimony in the Charles A. Straus case yesterday and published in The Oregonian, Waterford stated Mr. Minto deducted a certain amount of his salary each month and that he did not know why it was held out, but that it was, I desire to say that the above statement is a malicious lie and intended only to injure Mr. Minto and bring him into a transaction that he had nothing to do with.

It operated on Waterford May 21, 1907, and in order to get my pay for services

rendered it was necessary to write an order to the Postal Department instructing them to retain a certain amount of his monthly salary. Mr. Waterford signed the order, and it was left in the office of the cashier, Charles A. Straus. I desire to re-emphasize Mr. Minto, as he had absolutely nothing to do with the case. Mr. Waterford also states that he was not dismissed on account of intoxication. If he was not, he should have been, for he was drinking most of the time. H. I. KENNEY.
