SMOKE VEILS COMMISSION

Tariff Committee Spends Day Investigating Tobacco Business.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.-Tobacco and articles manufactured from tobacco com-ing under schedule F of the Dingley tariff law, were considered today at the public hearing before the House Commit-tee on Ways and Means, which has in hand the work of preparing a readjust-ment of the tariff law for presentation to the special session of Congress to be called next March. The total importa-tions of immanufactured tobacce for the year 1957 were valued at \$22,300,183, giving the Government a revenue of \$25,126,037, which indicates the importance of tills article in considering any readjustment of the tariff. 
