

PARIS SHAKEN BY MURDER SCANDAL

Steinhell's Widow Tries to Shield Guilty Man and Is Arrested.

DEPUTIES WANT INQUIRY

Woman Falsely Accuses Innocent Men to Protect Murderer—Suspicion That She Poisoned Faure. Magistrate Under Spell.

PARIS, Nov. 27.—The arrest of Mme. Steinhell last night, following her confession yesterday that for months she had been the murderer of her painter husband and Mme. Japy, who were found strangled in the house of the artist on the morning of May 21, her attempt to find the assassin and the hummer-like fanaticism with which she pursued her quest, were only a desperate ruse to conceal the real author of the crime, whom she knew, affords Paris the biggest sensation it has had in years.

PANIC STRIKES AUSTRIA

RUMORS OF TURKISH MOVEMENTS HIT STOCKS HARD.

TURKEY SAID TO HAVE FORMED ALLIANCE WITH SERBIA AND MONTENEGRO—BOYCOTT BEING PUSHED.

MOHAMMEDAN WOMEN ABUSED

LONDON, Nov. 27.—The Times correspondent at Constantinople in a dispatch referring to reported disorders in Bosnia and Herzegovina and especially to rumors of the ill-treatment of Mohammedan women by Austrian garrisons, which, he declares, unless contradicted, are bound to produce dangerous consequences in the present state of Turkish feeling against Austria, says:

GIRL HER OWN DETECTIVE

DECLARES RESIGNATION APPLIES TO TERM FOR WHICH HE WAS ELECTED.

SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 27.—(Special.)—When Justice Milo Root, of the Supreme Court of Washington, wrote to Governor Mead he admits that he did not think of resigning for the balance of the present term which ends in January, but meant to step down and out of the office and leave the Supreme Court without embarrassment forever.

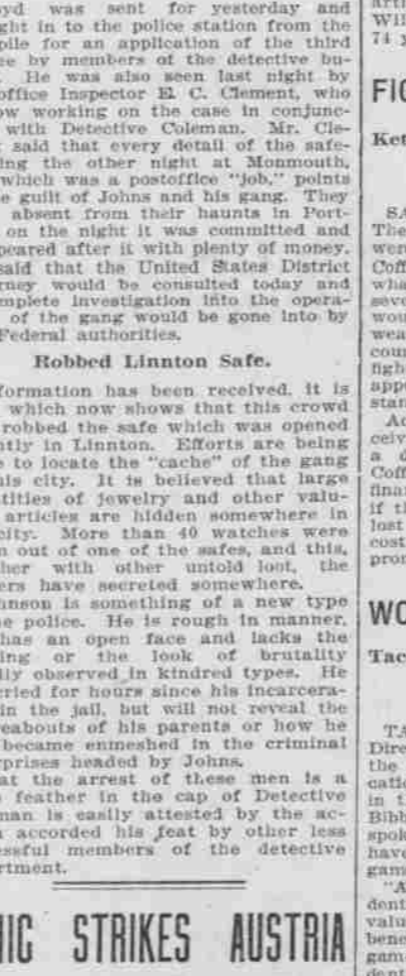
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MEAD AND COSGROVE TO APPOINT.

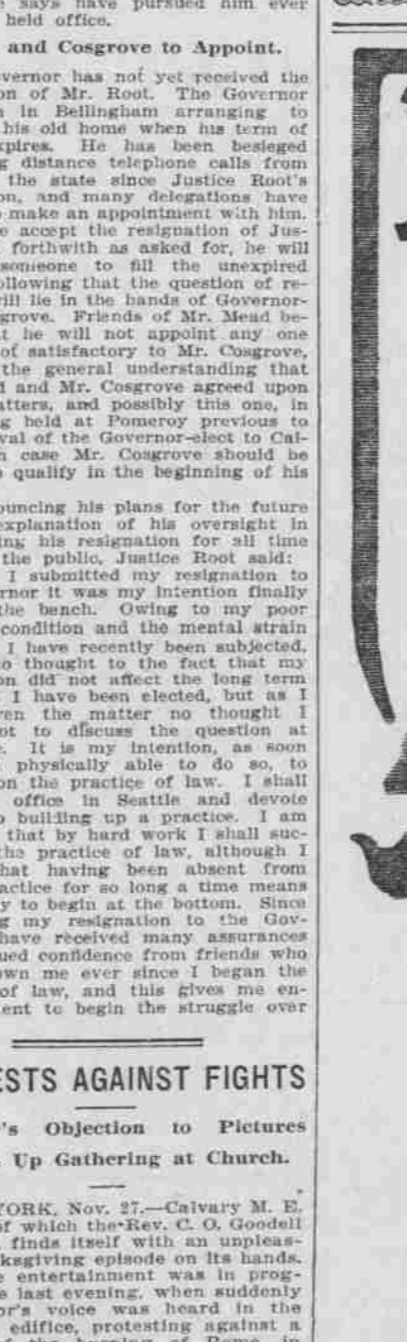
