

RALLY SAVES LOSS

Wheat Prices Close Steady at Chicago.

AFTER FLUCTUATING CENT

Opening Firm on Foreign Bulge, Market Weakens on Wet Weather News, but Recovers on Short Buying.

Cables received yesterday placed Argentina's exportable surplus of wheat at not to exceed 12,000,000 quarters. As compared with the surplus last year this shows a shortage of 40,000,000 bushels. The foreign markets were firmer, December wheat at Liverpool gaining a full penny on the day's operations, while the May option advanced 1/8.

The local wheat market was firm as a consequence of the stronger foreign advice and bluestem, which is scarce and in demand, was quoted 1 cent higher at 90 cents.

Other varieties were dull and unchanged. The coarse grains held steady, showing the weakness at the Merchants' Exchange was a sale of 200 tons of barley.

The flour market shows increased strength and prices have an upward tendency. Export flour is strong at \$3.70 and there is every likelihood of an advance in local grades in the near future.
