The bill for these aggregating \$3800. There are still 20 of the shipment unaccepted, the inspector for the fire department declining to take them because of some alleged defects. The contract for this lot of hydrants was entered into by the city 18 months ago, and it has been the cause of much trouble. There is to be an investigation of the matter.

It is doubtful if any other contract entered into by the city has caused so much trouble as this one for hydrants, which will cost the city \$3800. The Executive Board has ordered the fire committee to proceed with an investigation, and it has appeared from the report that the hydrants were defective.

The contracting company's officers are indignant over the treatment they have received from the city. Chief Campbell and Inspector Phillips reply that the hydrants furnished by Hogg & Swift were defective, and that they had to be sent to the foundry for repairs. The 20 still unaccepted are said to be at the foundry now. A large number of witnesses were subpoenaed for the hearing for tonight, but they will not have to appear until another date is set.

The Water Board also opened bids for the construction of the new East Side sewer, to be built at East Seventh and East Alder streets. There were 15 bids, indicating that it will cost about \$20,000 to have the sewer laid.
