Heavy Buying Continues in Hop Market.

IN ALL PARTS OF STATE

Every Purchase Supposed to Be Made for the Account of Klaber, Wolf & Netter - Mystery Surrounds the Deal.

There was no pause yesterday in the activity of the hop market. As was the case Saturday, nearly everything bought was for Klaber, Wolf & Netter. Particulars of their business were not obtainable but it was understood that purchases during the day amounted to about 1,000 bales. The prices paid were not known, except in the case of a few small lots, and these were at the figures current last week. The buying was done in nearly all sections, but was heaviest around Silverton.

There was some inquiry for wheat from Mexico and Texas, but in general the market was very quiet.

Celery is Higher Because of Scarcity in California. Yesterday's cable receipts of produce consisted of four cars of bananas, three of them very ripe and one in good condition, and one car each of oranges, sweet potatoes and celery. The orange market was firm at \$2.25 per bushel, an advance over last week's prices in consequence of the higher prices in California.
