

SOLONS ARE BUSY

Multnomah Delegation Plans Several Measures.

BANKING LAW PROPOSED

Though No Regular Plan of Action Has Been Adopted, Local Law-makers Are Already Drafting Bills for Coming Session.

The failure of the Multnomah County legislative delegation to meet regularly as an organization for the consideration of legislation has not deterred individual local members from looking into various measures that will be proposed to the law-makers at Salem next month.

A. W. Orton, Representative-elect has completed the draft of a bill introduced in many important respects after the Oklahoma bank guaranty law, which he proposes to introduce at the coming session of the Legislature.

At the recent meeting of the American Bankers Association at Denver, this organization went on record as opposing vigorously any attempt to regulate the banking business of the country on the plan of the Oklahoma law.

It was originally planned by the Statement members of the delegation that subjects of legislation should be subdivided among the different members, each to give his special attention to some particular line of law-making.

J. C. Bryant, another member of the delegation, is considering the subject of necessary water legislation. While he did not attend the recent meeting of the Oregon Conservation Commission, it is the intention of Mr. Bryant to study the question of the state's needs on this subject, and to recommend to the support of the delegation such legislation on this important matter as he constantly believes to conserve the important resources of the state.

Originally E. J. Jaeger, another member of the delegation, had planned to see that a bill providing for some good roads legislation would be proposed. Later he learned that the Portland Automobile Club was preparing a similar bill and he has joined with that organization in drafting it.

LIVERYMAN FINED HEAVILY

Accused of Violating Local Option Law in Idm County.

ALBANY, Or., Dec. 16.—(Special.)—Albert Peacock, proprietor of the Fashion livery stable, was today fined \$100 and costs by Judge Peckham for violating a city ordinance, embracing the provisions of the local option liquor law.

Peacock's stable was raided by officers last Friday and two barrels of bottled beer captured. Peacock interposed no defense to the city's evidence in the Recorder's Court today. The case probably will be appealed to the Circuit Court.
