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Board of Education Decides on Tax of 4.7 Mills.

WILL PRODUCE \$1,034,000

Resolution to Raise Salaries of Teachers is Adopted by 4-to-1 Vote, and Matter Will Be Put on Ballots for Decision.

At the meeting of the City Board of Education last night the directors, by a vote of 4 to 1, decided to submit a petition increasing the salaries of the school teachers from 5 to 15 per cent, according to grades, to the taxpayers for ratification, and also fixed the school levy at 4.7 mills on a property valuation of approximately \$20,000,000. This would place \$1,034,000 available for school uses. The school fund for the ensuing year, including repairs to buildings, erecting of new schools, salaries to teachers and incidental expenses is estimated at \$1,200,000, which fund is made of the taxpayers. Of this sum \$1,000,000 is available in moneys due the department from the county and state on scholarship pro rata taxes, the city receiving \$2 per pupil, and there is estimated to be 25,000 children in the schools. A census is now being taken, and every effort is being made to have it complete as possible as some of the directors were of the opinion that the city schools were the loser on last year's census, which showed but 20,000 pupils.

The Item of Expense for the coming year include remodeling and repairing of several of the schools, repairs to sanitation, building of additions and the erection of new buildings. An addition is needed to the present school building, the Vernon, Peninsula, Oakley Green, Irvington and Creston schools. More room is also needed at Mount Taylor and Glenwood, and these two buildings are to be materially altered; while the new Williams-Avenue School figures prominently in the estimate.

The school board also voted to commission the building committee to determine for bids during the next 30 days for the erection of the new Albus High School, to be located on the corner of Taylor and Glenwood, and these two buildings are to be materially altered; while the new Williams-Avenue School figures prominently in the estimate.
