



WHERE RAIL AND VESSEL MEET

CONTINUOUS panorama, in the photographs above and below, of Portland's Upper Harbor and business section, taken from a point on the East Side of the Willamette River, and showing the city's four transriver bridges and over one mile of the water front from Inman, Poulsen & Co.'s mill to the Steel bridge. The greater part of the city's business district, including many important buildings, is in prominent view. The double-page drawing in the center shows the Union Terminal Station, with the freight yards and sheds of the various railroads operating from Portland. The lower harbor, where are located the great grain docks from which Portland's export business is largely done, is likewise visible in the middle picture.
