

SOLORS NOTE FOR LESLEY L. JONES

Ankeny's Successor Named at Olympia With but Little Opposition.

OLD MAN MAKES THREATS

Promise of Spectator to Blow Up Legislators is Only Ripple of Excitement During Progress of Vote.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Jan. 19.—(Special.)

Devoid of excitement that has heretofore attended elections in this state, the election of Wesley L. Jones, of North Yakima, to succeed Senator Levi Ankeny, of Walla Walla, was accomplished shortly after noon today by two branches of the Legislature assembled in separate sessions, Jones receiving every Republican vote, or 125 out of 137 members.

Threat to Kill.

The old man was turned over to friends by Senator Cottrell and taken out of town. He showed up again yesterday and talked against Jones to anyone who would listen to him.

Cameron Speaks in Senate.

In the Senate S. J. Cameron, in nominating Jones, was followed by Bassett, Meyers, Allen, Fairbanks and Cox. Senator McGowan nominated Cottrell, saying that he believed all the commendatory things that had been said concerning Mr. Jones.
