NEW PUSH CLUB FORMED

SEELWOOD AND MIDWAY PEOPLE HOLD MASS MEETING. Subject of Opening East Seventeenth Street to Seelwood Discussed in Detail. A mass meeting of representative citizens of Midway and Seelwood was held in the public hall at Midway last night to take steps toward having East Seventeenth street opened through Midway and the Ladd farm. The park question was also discussed, and a permanent improvement club was formed. Frank Gibson presided, and set forth in a few remarks the object of the meeting. Councilman A. N. Willis, by the use of a map, explained what is intended in the opening of East Seventeenth street. The plan is to open the street from its present end at Atmsley avenue to the Ladd farm, and then through the Ladd farm by the Ladd estate 300 feet east of the Milwaukee road to Seelwood, or the south side of the farm, a total distance of about one mile. As some houses in Midway must be moved and some lots appropriated, Mr. Willis explained that such damages would be paid for. After hearing Councilman Willis, the meeting voted to proceed with the temporary organization of a push club. Frank Gibson being elected temporary chairman and H. Tabke, temporary secretary. L. W. Darling, William S. Simpson and W. A. Sanders were appointed a committee on constitution, to report next Thursday night. At that meeting a special committee will be appointed to investigate the proposed extension of East Seventeenth and assist in its opening if found satisfactory. The park question was discussed by Councilman A. N. Willis, Walter Adams and L. W. Darling, it being the prevailing opinion that Midway and Seelwood ought to stand together on this question. The Mayor's veto of the ordinance authorizing the purchase of the 12 acres at Seelwood was commented on

ACCUSED OF WIRE-TAPPING

John Peterson Arrested on Charge of Stealing "Juice." Wire tapping for lights and power to run a little motor landed John Peterson, a fireman, who does private work and maintains a little workshop in the rooming-house at 22 1/2 Second street, in the County Jail yesterday afternoon, charged with stealing electric current from the Portland General Electric Company.
