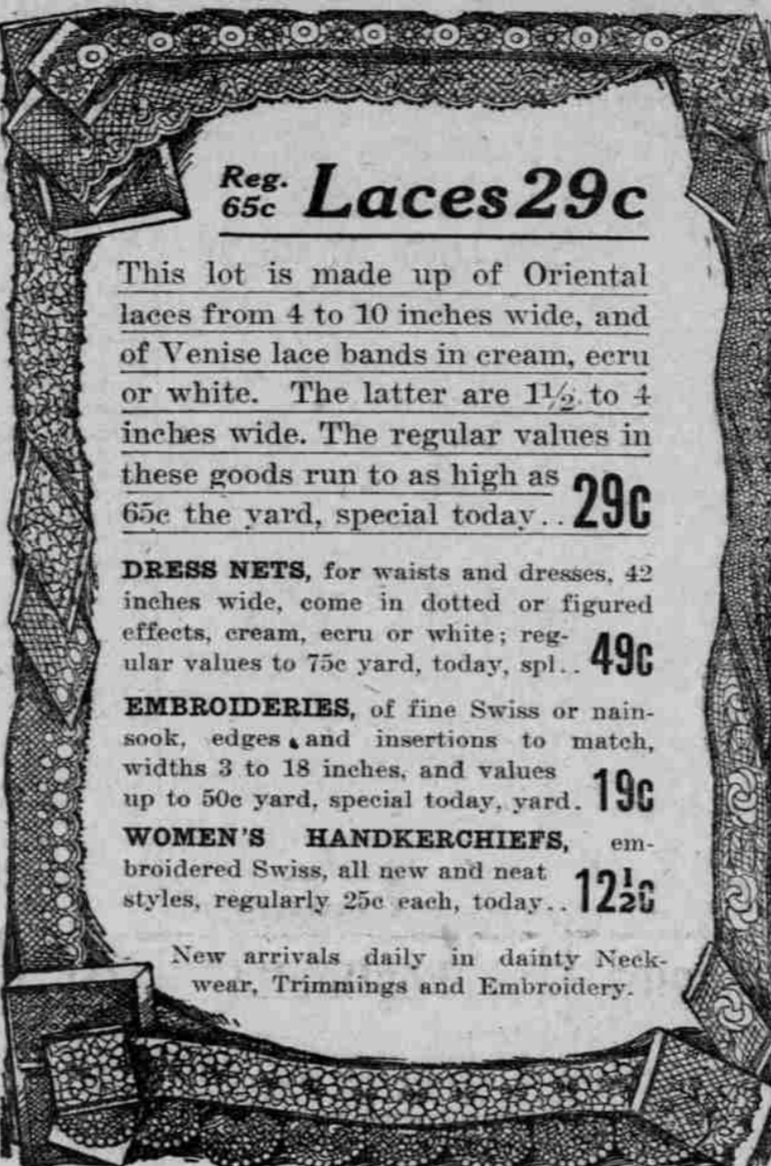

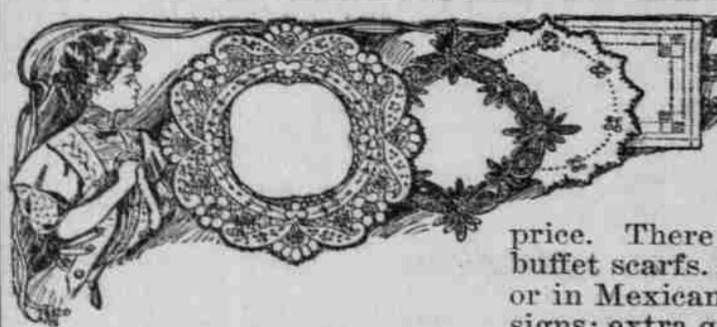

PUT GOVERNMENT IN HOLE

Peculiar Motive of Mooted Japanese Boycott of Seattle Fair.
VICTORIA, B. C., March 18.—The Hochi of Tokyo explains that the proposed boycott of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition, since abandoned, was not started as an anti-American movement, but was directed against the Tokyo government as an objection to the taxation on fabrics, the object of the agitation being to place the government in an awkward position regarding the Seattle Exposition. The agitation against the tax on fabrics has been universal and a mock funeral of the Katsura government was held at Kyoto in this connection.
Complaint has been made to the Japanese authorities that Japanese traders have sent a large amount of merchandise to India bearing revolutionary trade marks aimed against the British government.
World's Fair for Winnipeg.
WINNIPEG, Man., March 18.—Winnipeg has decided to have a world's exposition in 1912. A committee of citizens which had been sent to St. Louis, Seattle, Chicago and Portland reported favorably on the project last night, and it was decided to raise a fund of \$2,000,000 for it.

MAKES RIVAL FOR DALNY

China Establishes Free Port to Divert Trade From Japan.
VICTORIA, B. C., March 18.—Advices were brought by the steamer Iyo Maru that the Chinese government is surveying a new harbor in the Gulf of Pechili, called Leishan, about 40 miles north of Shanghai, for use as a Chinese national port in opposition to the Japanese port of Dairen.
The harbor is free from ice in winter and a breakwater will be built to render it safe. The Chinese government intends to establish the harbor as a free port and has engaged a British engineer to design the harbor work. It is expected to divert the trade of Manchuria from Japan by way of this port.
Frank Marcellus Dies in Chair.
ELGIN, Or., March 18.—(Special).—At his home, three miles north of Elgin, Frank Marcellus died yesterday. He arose, did his chores and after eating breakfast went into an adjoining room, telling his wife his arm hurt him and something was wrong. W. L. Bussars, a neighbor, asked, "What's the matter?" Mr. Marcellus replied: "God knows—I don't," which were his last words, for he died before he could be removed from his chair. He was an inveterate smoker.

JOKER IN REFORM BILL

Anti-Gambling Measure Legalizes Poolselling and Race Bets.
DENVER, March 18.—A sensation was caused in the lower branch of the Colorado Legislature when it was discovered that a bill introduced a few days ago by Representative Wilder, defining and prescribing the statutes relating to gambling, contained a clause that would apparently legalize pool-selling and betting on horse-racing in the state. The bill as introduced carries an emergency clause, and a vigorous effort is being made to push it through.
