NORMAL COURSE STRONGER

Willamette Raises Standard of Training Work for Teachers.

SALEM, Or., March 28.—(Special.)—President Hiram M. Williams, of the university, announces that the university, beginning with the Autumn term, 1909, will raise the standard for graduation from the normal to a four-year course.

During the past year it has been part of the plan to institute a first-class normal course in Willamette University for the coming year.
