John Berg, the light heavyweight grappler who recently won the championship of Europe in that division while touring the continent with George Hackenschmidt, the Russian Lion, and who wrestles under the name of Young Hackenschmidt by virtue of permission given by the noted European athlete, announces that he is in better shape for his match Friday night with Dr. B. F. Roller, of Seattle, than ever before in his career.

When Berg came west in January it was with the avowed intention of going to Seattle to meet Roller, but at that time the Seattle medical board had taken the boxing game and would not listen to a wrestling proposition. Since then Roller has been unable to secure matches with the padded man, and he has decided to return to his first love, wrestling.

Still, Berg must have a great deal of confidence in himself, for Roller offered him a handicap match, which Berg refused, and said he would consider only a straight match with the Seattle man, because he is one of the most consistent horse racers here.
