MISSING MAN FOUND DEAD

Patrick M. McGlone Was Drowned Near Pocatello. POCATELLO, Idaho, March 30.—(Special)—Patrick M. McGlone suddenly disappeared from his home in this city the night of January 13 this year. Today his partially decomposed body was found in the Port Neuf River, two miles below town. McGlone was a blacksmith employed in the shops of the Shore Line. On the day of his disappearance he had been drinking heavily. It is apparent that on his way home he fell in the river and was drowned.
