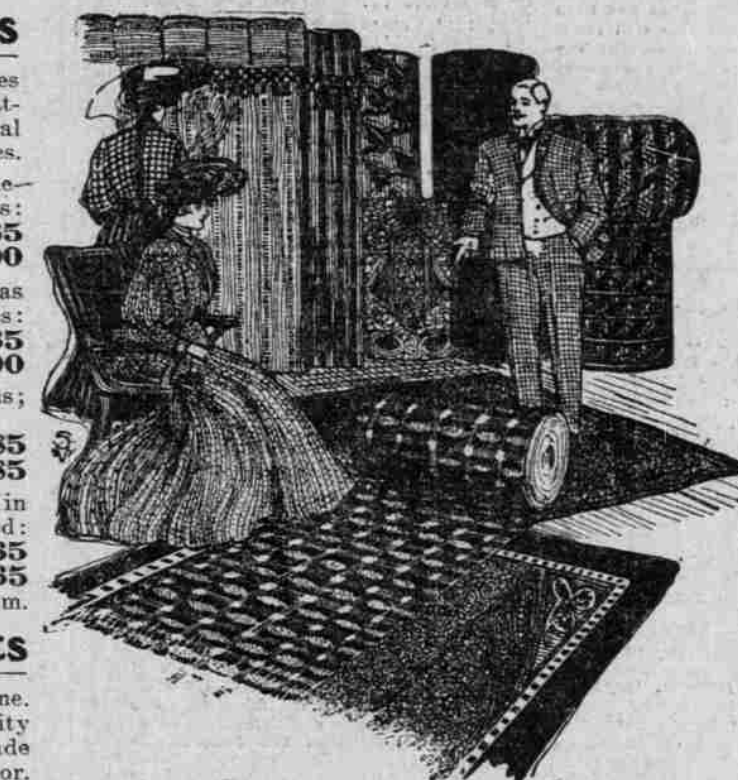

Medals Hung Up by Multnomah and Races Are Supervised by Instructor Hilton.

Last night the Multnomah Athletic Club held its first aquatic meet in the big swimming pool. This branch of sport is in charge of E. Hilton, the club's new swimming instructor. A good-sized crowd was present and some good swimming was seen. The aquatic programme consisted of races at various distances, and for which medals were hung up for the winners by the club. The first event on the programme was the 50-yard swim by the senior class. This event was a hot struggle between Sharp and Dent, the former winning by a narrow margin of a few inches. This was followed by the 100-yard dash in which Robert Krohn was the victor in the junior event for 100 yards, while Dent won the senior century from Wakeman in the fast time of 1:12. ## SON BLOCKS PROBATE CASE

### Rushes Into Courtroom Just in Time to Stop Court Proceedings.

CINCINNATI, April 20.—George D. He said the record would show he had protected the estate to his personal sacrifice. He has been since August 3 last year in Tucson, Ariz., on business.
