Detective Says He Was Hired to Watch Prosecution and Get Letters.

LAWYERS IN FURIOUS ROW

SEAN FRANCISCO, May 19.—Into the trial of Patrick Calhoun, president of the United Railroads, there has been today an extraordinary chapter dealing with the uses and methods of detectives.
